#### **Sarah Jones**, *Senior Institutional Support Officer DCC*

Sarah's current work focuses on the DCC's institutional engagement programme. She is leading DCC support for several universities, helping them to scope researchers' requirements, deliver training, customise DMPonline and implement research data management services. She also develops resources on research data policy and data management planning and is involved in supporting JISC Managing Research Data projects.
